TICKETS ONLINE

For Films and Events, visit SKYWAYFILMFESTIVAL.ORG and select schedule. Then, choose your film or event and you will be directed on how to purchase tickets

TICKET/PASS PICK-UP

Patrons who order tickets online must pick-up hard tickets at the Manatee Performing Arts Center Box office(open during festival and Mon.-Fri.(10 AM – 5 PM), Sat. (10 AM – 2 PM). You must have a photo ID or have your purchase receipt.

For all films, you must pick up your tickets at least 15 minutes prior to the film screening, and be seated prior to show time. If you are not seated when the film starts, your seat could be released to our rush line.

DAY OF SHOW SALES

If you haven't ordered online and wish to purchase a ticket for a film that day, please go to the Manatee Performing Arts Center box office to purchase in person. Regular Film Screenings \$12 and Special Screenings (Opening and Closing Films) \$15.

WAIT LIST/RUSH LINE SALES

For SOLD OUT films, show up before the start time and join the rush line. At 5 minutes prior to film screening we will start selling tickets on an available seat basis. We accept cash ONLY for these tickets.

There are no refunds. Tickets may be exchanged for another screening based on availability at the Manatee Performing Arts Center box office.




